Playing Between the Dots:
Discovering Freedom in Performance through Early Recordings

Piano Network, 4640 N Brandywine Dr., Peoria

As commercial recording technology and performance standards have become ever cleaner through the last century, have we lost some of the quasi-improvisatory life of the original spirit of the music? This talk will explore what we might learn from early recordings, especially those made by the composers themselves. Original recordings of their own works by pianist-composers such as Bartok, Prokofiev, and Rachmaninoff demonstrate a sense of freedom and flexibility, especially regarding rhythmic aspects, that is often absent in many of today's performances. Through studying these, we can attempt to come closer to rediscovering this quality in performance.

General Information for Teachers

Concert Date: Saturday, April 28, 2018, 4pm ICC – Performing Arts Center Registration Fee \$25 per student – check made out to teacher.

Registration Deadline – Feb. 2, 2018

Rehearsal dates are Saturdays: March 17, April 7, 9-noon Sundays: April 15, April 22, 1:30-4:30 Dress Rehearsal: April 28

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Rehearsals will take place at Illinois Central College, piano lab.

Rehearsals will run from 9-12 with twenty minute time slots for each group.

Playing the correct notes is a given – playing as an ensemble requires additional skills which most piano students do not have.

Students must know the music at the first rehearsal. Period.

If a student is not able to play the piece/s at the first rehearsal, parents will be notified of lack of preparation on the part of the student/teacher.

Teacher is to place students in the group which is 2 levels below the repertoire they currently play. Please inform your parents.

Students must practice the rhythm and play with steady beat.

Students/teachers must practice the pieces with a metronome. Slow tempo – medium – up to performance tempo which will be forthcoming.

Students and Teachers will wear the Monster concert t-shirt and dark pants to the concert.
