### PAMTA GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

April 24, 2017, Illinois Central College

Our April meeting at ICC opened at 11:00 after we all heard from The Estampe Trio. One of the performers was MTNA member Mickey Chien. This was an incredible performance!

Our President Rosa Chang started our meeting with the minutes of our last meeting in February, since our March meeting was cancelled. Our Treasurer's report was read and approved.

President Chang mentioned the highlights of the State Board meeting of April 23rd which was an online Teleconference, with members talking and communicating together. Rosa spoke about the new competitions that will be starting this year. All district auditions have been eliminated and there will now be ISMTA State competitions divided into two groups. The north group will be Joliet and north, and the south group will be anything south of Joliet, down to the Gateway Arch groups. The location of the north group is not yet known, but the group in the south will be at Millikin and Dr. Silvan Negrutiu will be the chairman. This will eliminate the southern district's students having to complete with Chicago. This will also save money for our State. Our auditions will be held during the second week of October. The winners of the ISMTA groups will perform in the winner's recital on Friday night. If the winners do not play at the State Conference, they will forfeit their monetary awards. There will be Collegiate, Senior, Junior and elementary winners.

PROGRAMS: Our 1st vice president said our May program would be presentation of the Monster Concert Music at Piano Network. The camp scholarship winner will also be present to play and receive his award. The members will go to lunch afterwards at Biaggi;s.

President Rosa Chang covered old business. She reminded everyone that our membership dues are now due. Send them in before July 31st so you can have your name in our book.

### Meeting minutes, continued:

In the last newsletter a form for member of the year was included. We are to nominate a member for this award and send it to Rosa before the next meeting. That person will be given the award at our banquet dinner at the State Conference in the fall.

New business: Scheduling of the Honors Recital was discussed. It was recommended that the date be made closer to the AIM Performance Exams, so the students' pieces would be fresh in their minds.
