2013 HIGH SCHOOL PIANO CAMP

Millikin University's School of Music is now accepting registrations for its 2013 High School Piano Camp (July 7-13). Intermediate to advanced students in grades 9-12 who are currently taking piano lessons are encouraged to spend six days at our all-Steinway school to improve, hone and perfect their piano skills! Sessions in the mornings will feature an overview of the history of jazz, piano technique and an opportunity to learn and rehearse a jazz duet piece. After lunch, students will have time to practice and receive private lessons from Millikin piano faculty as well as participate in workshops on performance anxiety and jazz improvisation. Evening entertainments will include bowling, miniature golf, game night and a trip to Decatur's historic Avon Theater for a movie. Students can choose to attend this camp as a commuter or as a resident. Residents will stay in air-conditioned double-rooms. The cost of this camp is \$520 for residents/\$320 for commuters: all meals and a daily snack are included. Students will be asked to prepare two pieces of contrasting styles for this camp.
