Each student will continue to develop their pianistic abilities and enrich their musical experiences by attending a variety of courses in keyboard musicianship, music history, jazz improvisation and music composition.

It will run from Monday, June 6th through Friday, June 10th, 2016. This is a commuter camp only with the cost being \$325 which includes meals and a camp t-shirt.
