Exams are \$8.00 per student. There is a \$5.00 charge per medal for each student who is new to AIM. Please print students' names clearly as that is how the student's name will appear on their certificate. Please note that students who are participating in the Sonata/Sonatina Festival may use their piece as one of their AIM pieces. Use the piece for the appropriate music period that it is in. If you have any questions, please contact Pam.
