AIM dates are March 28 and 29.

The cost of medals is now \$5.50 each. Exam fees remain \$8.00 per student.

AIM Performance Exams will use the NEW Syllabus. This means students must be prepared to play the NEW TECHNIQUE requirements.

You will receive your judging folders and monitor folders (including clipboard) at that time. Instructions will be discussed. All workers will receive a name tag.

All students times and room assignments will be sent as soon as they are completed. Thank you for your patience.

VOLUNTEERS FOR SONATINA / SONATA FESTIVAL

Please be at ICC at 8:00 in room 125A for your schedules and sheets and further instructions. You may park in the back -- parking lot E. If you are unable to work please ask one of your students' parents to take your place. We need every single job covered.

- Please wear comfortable shoes for walking and big smile for the audience and students.
- 2. There will be 2 volunteers for each of the performing rooms so you are not alone.
- 3. Please have parents and students leave their coats and "stuff" in room 125A, so there is more room in the performance room. There will be 2 people in that room to watch the coats and belongings!
- 4. Please use your judgment on letting in younger students with the parents if they are not one of the contestants. Children under 4 should **not** go in the room.
- 5. There is limited seating in these rooms (except for the LRH) so use your judgment on this one.
- 6. IF there is a family that is disruptive or crying babies, please have them go to room 125A.
- 7. Allow performer time to warm-up for 30 seconds to try out the piano. NO part or portion of their sonatina / sonata allowed for warm-up.
- 8. ANNOUNCE at the beginning and also as people are entering the room NO CELL PHONES or PAGERS. Please turn off. There will be signs to tell them but a little extra reminder is good. No video or recording. No pictures.
- 9. You do not give the music to the judge. All pieces MUST be memorized.
- 10. You will be given a clip-board with the schedule on it and the students name and time.
- 11. The judge will have the times and the performer's name.
- 12. Please encourage the audience to clap when the performer is through and remind the performer that they should bow when they are done.

- 13. There will be a 10 minute break after each level has been completed, for the judge to tally up the winners, 1st, 2nd, and honorable mention/mentions. Be sure to clear the room so the judge can think clearly and place the non-winners in an envelope. This envelope and the winners score sheets must be taken to 120A immediately for filing.
- 14. When the room is totally done, please clean up the room and put the chairs back the way they were.
- 15. All volunteers, teachers and judges can go to the Lecture Recital Hall when they are done.
- 16. Please do NOT let anyone in the room when the performers have started. Also do not let anyone out while the performers are playing. This is a very big distraction to the students.
- 17. Winners will be announced after the level has completed. The Awards will be given out at the recital. Student must be present to win. Recital is in the LRH between 11:30 and 12:00.
- 18. If you can, check to see that the performers do NOT have on bracelets, long nails or fingernail polish.
- 19. Tell the performers that they will receive certificates and comment sheets from their teacher.

There will be water for the judges, volunteers and teachers in room 120. Be sure to keep the judge supplied with anything they need.
