Daily drop off will be between 7:45 and 8:00 a.m. and pick up will be at 5:30 p.m. A variety of courses in keyboard musicianship, music history, jazz improvisation and music composition will be offered. There will be social activities as well. A final concert will be held at Dingeldine Music Center at 5 p.m. on Friday, July 24th and will feature solo and ensemble performances by all the students. PAMTA GENERAL MEETING FEBRARY 23, 2015

The PAMTA general meeting was called to order by president Philippa Williams. The secretary's report was read and approved. The treasurer's report was read and placed on file. The ending balance in the checking account at the end of December 2014 is \$3146.66. The savings account is \$8448.92. The Sonata/Sonatina Festival brought in \$870.00

The Scholarship Competition is to be held Feb. 28, 2015 at 1st Christian Church. There are 5 entrants. The reason for the Scholarship Competition being held in Feb. is because camp applications are usually due early in March. Jr. High is 6-7-8 grades and Sr. High is 9-12 grades. There was a discussion about the camp scholarship awards. A motion was made by Polly Sharp and 2nd by Brenda Conroy that the winners of each division, Jr. High and Sr. High, would receive up to \$500.00 or the cost of the camp whichever is less. The motion carried. Scholarship is not limited to piano, but there would be a different judge for other instruments.

There was discussion if we need or have a syllabus for other instruments. No resolution was made at that time.

The Duet Recital was a success with 44 performers playing 22 duet pieces. Eight teachers were represented.

AIM Registrations are due by Feb. 28. If pieces are not memorized the test is incomplete.

Monster Concert plans are being developed. It was announced that there will be 2 conductors. Dan Dietrich has agreed to direct and the other prospective conductor has not been contacted as yet.

The offices of PAMTA that are needed to be filled are 1st Vice President, Treasurer, and publicity chairperson. Sue Twitty allowed her name for 1st Vice President and Kirsten Jones allowed her name to be Treasurer.

The Board needs proposals for the Budget for 2016 and the person in charge of her committee need to give the numbers to Philippa.

Sue Twitty reported that the Sonata/Sonatina Festival was a great event with 95% going very well. More minutes are needed to be scheduled for each student. It was suggested that only parents would be allowed in the room when their child is playing. Another suggestion was to have the registration table closer to the entrance from Parking Lot E. A big thank you to all those who participated in this great event.

The March general meeting will be on March 30, 2015 at 1st Christian Church with guest, Dr. Silvan Negrutiu from Millikin University. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Janet Dickerson and seconded by Polly Sharp at 11:15
