PAMTA MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 22, 2012 FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH PEORIA, ILLINOIS

The program portion of the meeting opened at 10:10 a.m. with Karen Koch doing a presentation about the Music Educator's Marketplace. She spoke about and brought materials which focused on reading.

The business portion of the meeting began at 11:15 a.m. after members and guests had time to purchase materials from Karen. There were 19 members and two guests present. President, Janet Dickerson, presided over the meeting.

The minutes of the September 24th meeting were approved as corrected.
