UPCOMING RECITAL BY DR. CHUNG-HA KIM

On Sunday, November 22, the School of Music at Millikin University continues its second season of the Faculty Recital Series. Pianist and Steinway Artist Dr. Chung-Ha Kim will an exciting program of virtuosic masterpieces by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, César Franck, Robert Schumann, and Béla Bartók. This concert is free to the public and will take place on Sunday, November 22 at 4 pm in Kaeuper Hall in the Perkinson Music Center on Millikin's campus.

Chung-Ha Kim grew up in Germany and moved to the US in 1995 to pursue a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance at the Manhattan School of Music in New York. She subsequently earned a Master of Music and a Doctor of Musical Arts at the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music. At Millikin University, Dr. Kim teaches applied piano, class piano, piano pedagogy and preparatory piano. Dr. Kim remains active as a solo as well as collaborative pianist: her most recent recitals took place at the Robert-Schumann Hochschule in Düsseldorf (Germany), Blackburn College in Carlinville (Illinois), University of Louisiana and University of Chicago. She was invited to give masterclasses at Illinois State University, University of Chicago, Southern Illinois University, Harper College and Mount Union College (Ohio). An active member of the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA), Dr. Kim currently serves as the president of the Decatur Area Music Teachers Association (DAMTA). She is also a member of the National Federation of Music Clubs and Pi Kappa Lambda. Dr. Kim has released three CDs: Maurice Ravel: *Miroirs* (2013), *A Palace of Strangers* (2013) and *Carnival of Animals* (2014) are available on itunes and Amazon. Dr. Kim became a US citizen in 2013 and was named Steinway Artist in September 2014. More information can be found at www.chunghakim.com.
